The carnival committee are already busy meeting to plan next year's carnival. Can you find them, help them contact stall holders, and tick off some jobs on the way? X marks your starting point. Follow the directions and clues. At the end you will be left with just one stall holder, one number and the secret location of the committee's meetings. Enter your results online for a chance to win a £5 voucher.



<p>We start the hunt for the committee at the railway bridge on Glossop Road heading for Charlesworth</p>	<p>CLUE 1. The TPT trail no. to Broadbottom, is the no. of chairs needed for the tea tent, cross this date off your list.</p>	<p>From clue 1 head up Glossop road to Charlesworth, after the bridge find the blue sign on the right.</p>	<p>CLUE2. Find a sign that tells you when the railway steps were built. This is not the location of the meeting.</p>
<p>Continue on towards Charlesworth.</p>	<p>CLUE 3. Stop at St Margaret's school, make contact with one of the stall holders, cross them off your list.</p>	<p>Carry on towards Charlesworth</p>	<p>CLUE 4. At Hargate Hill, the last digits of the college phone number is the number of tables needed.</p>
<p>Carry on towards Charlesworth</p>	<p>FUN FACT. The houses on your right were once Police Houses</p>	<p>When you get to the green bench near the rugby club, have a rest, the next clue is near.</p>	<p>CLUE 5. Find the picture in the next box, nearby is a sign, combine the name with the sponsor's location, cross off a stall holder.</p>
	<p>Carry on back towards Charlesworth. Stop at the first road on your right</p>	<p>CLUE 6. The number of letters in the first road name is the number of bins you need to order. Cross it off your list.</p>	<p>FUN FACT. In recent times the carnival and the olympics have not been a good mix.</p>
<p>Cross the road carefully to find the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 7. Look in the churchyard for this grave, the location named is not where the committee is meeting.</p>		<p>Cross back to the pavement side of the road. Carry on towards the village. Turn right down Lee Vale drive.</p>
<p>Turn left onto Hayden Fold at the end carry on to the footpath, coming out by the public toilets.</p>	<p>Carefully cross the road to school for the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 8. The school is not the committee meeting place, cross it off the list.</p>	<p>FUN FACT. The ancient name of the village was: Cheveneswrde (enclosure near 'Caefl' - River Etherow)</p>

<p>Head down the road then turn left going through the gate onto the footpath leading to the church.</p>		<p>At the church door stop, turn around and look to your right for the next clue</p>	<p>CLUE 9. The grave directly in front mentions a location where the committee are not meeting.</p>
<p>Turn up the hill and follow the path out of the church yard. When you reach the road turn left to the centre of the village</p>	<p>At the top of Long Lane cross the road carefully. Carry on just past the George &amp; Dragon to the lovely new houses</p>	<p>CLUE 10. Combine a new cottage name with old pub to contact a stall holder.</p>	<p>Cross the road to the War Memorial for your next clue</p>
<p>CLUE 11. On the cenotaph eliminate a stall holder who shares a name with a bird.</p>	<p>Cross the road towards the phone box then turn left up Town Lane. At the front of the school find the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 12. The year school was established is not the start time of a committee meeting.</p>	<p>FUN FACT. Up until the 1970's there was a reservoir in the school grounds.</p>
<p>Turn to your left and make your way to the well.</p>	<p>FUN FACT. The village had two schools until the 1990's. They joined and became infant and junior sites.</p>	<p>CLUE 13. Near the corner of the well cross off a stall holder whose initials are on the small plaque.</p>	<p>Turn right up the cobbled path. Turn right and continue up Back Lane. Your next clue will be on the left.</p>
	<p>CLUE 14. Find the Manse. The date it was built is another committee meeting time you can cross off the list.</p>	<p>Turn back towards the village. Walk a short distance then take your first left onto Boggard Lane.</p>	<p>The next part is not pushchair friendly (over a stile and across a field). You can rejoin at the play area on the Rec</p>
<p>Take the first footpath on the right (Cown Edge Way) going over the stile. Follow the path down the hill.</p>	<p>Cross the stile to the village green, site of our amazing carnival, keep going on the left of the field to the track.</p>	<p>CLUE 15. The committee is not meeting at the club here. Stop on the green, play and relax.</p>	<p>Continue down the track. Take the footpath on your left to Lee Head. Carry on towards Glossop Road.</p>

<p>Cross the road carefully to Dyson's (friend to the carnival and village institution) for the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 16. The date this favourite shop was established is the number of beers you have to order. Cross off your list.</p>	<p>Head to Chisworth, halfway down the hill stop at Coombes Lane (on your left) for the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 17. The location of the old dye works is somewhere the committee is not meeting.</p>
<p>FUN FACT. This is the first turn on the fell race route. Why not have a go next year!</p>	<p>Carry on towards Chisworth. At the bottom of the dip is the next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 18. At the bottom of the hill check your location on the houses, remove this location as a meeting point.</p>	<p>Carry on the main road through Chisworth. When you reach the church you have another clue.</p>
	<p>CLUE 19. Eliminate the stall holder whose name matches that of a person on The Roll and whose initials are on the front of the church.</p>	<p>Carry on towards Marple. Just a few meters further for your next clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 20. Ten houses from 1829, the sign on the front shows another stall holder to cross off.</p>
<p>You're nearly there, just a little further. Carry on in the same direction. Just past the bus shelter is your final clue.</p>	<p>CLUE 21. Find the house built in 1880, cross off the stall holder who shares a name.</p>

For a change of scenery if you are heading back to the village: go down the road on your right towards Kinderlee development, take the footpath that goes behind the pond (on the right), follow it through the wooded area and on to a field with some chicken runs. This footpath takes you to Woodseats Lane turn right up the hill to get back to Marple Road. **\*\*Unfortunately this route is unsuitable for push chairs.\*\***
